I would like to start by thanking pupils, parents, teachers and support staff for all they have contributed to over this year so far. So let us reflect on just a few of the key milestones since September:

- Nuneaton Academy celebrated some of its best outcomes ever with some significant achievements for pupils, particularly for Art, Photography and French. This has led to a significant uptake of pupils looking to study French at GCSE and I know Year 9's will be considering their options when we start the pathways process in the coming term.
- Year 7s have been visiting Coventry University where they have been experiencing first-hand the benefits of a good education, hard work and resilience. We continue to raise aspirations with our pupils and have plenty more planned during the course of the year, specifically an opportunity to visit the Big Bang exhibit in the summer term and Year 10 mock interviews, preparing them for the competitive world we live in. Our intention for these is to invite alumni of Nuneaton Academy in key positions in our area, for example, the police, social services and education, back into school to show our pupils what they can go on to achieve.
- Year 11s have had booster sessions with PetXi, a nationally successful company determined to improve outcomes for pupils in GCSE's.
- Ofsted visited in November and ratified the work of our teachers, support staff, Trust and senior leaders in removing special measures.
- Free breakfast club has been set up since October half term, offering free bagels for our pupils to ensure they are fed and ready to learn from the very beginning of the day.

I look forward to welcoming pupils and staff back into school in the New Year and hope you all have a restful break.
